RECLAIMING THE INDO- PACIFIC NARRATIVE

CONCEPT OF 'INDO PACIFIC'	First time, the term 'Indo Pacific' was used by the Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe on Indian soil in 2007. Then, he said that there is a connect between the Indian Ocean and the Pacific Ocean. India considers two important aspects within the scope of this term: One, centrality of the ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations), which is necessary to take forward the notion of Indo-Pacific. Second, with respect for international laws, especially the United Nations Convention on Law of the Sea, 1982 (UNCLOS) at the time of disputes, particularly over the South China Sea.
SIGNIFICANCE OF THE INDO PACIFIC REGION	It is a very rich region in terms of natural resources (fisheries, oil, gas) as well as mineral resources. About 3.5 trillion dollars international trade flows through the South China Sea. Trade of some of the major economies like China, Japan, Korea or the west coast of the United States goes through the South China Sea. About 50% of India's trade is conducted through the South China Sea.
What are India's key priorities in this regard?	 ✓ India views the Indo-Pacific as a geographic and strategic expanse, along with the 10 ASEAN countries connecting the two great oceans. ✓ Inclusiveness, openness, and ASEAN centrality and unity, therefore, lie at the heart of the Indian notion of Indo-Pacific. ✓ Security in the region must be maintained through dialogue, a common rules-based order, and freedom of navigation. ✓ Besides, unimpeded commerce and settlement of disputes in accordance with international law are also the priorities. ✓ More connectivity initiatives, with respect for sovereignty, territorial integrity, good governance, transparency, and sustainability should be promoted.
PRESENT CONTEXT	At the 34th summit of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) in Bangkok in June, its member states finally managed to articulate a collective vision for the Indo-Pacific region in a document titled "The ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific".
