	Spektr-R was launched in 2011 to observe black holes, neutron stars and magnetic fields. Its successor will take up similar duties.
Spektr	✓ It is a Russian scientific satellite with a 10 m (33 ft) radio
(or RadioAstron)	telescope on board.
	✓ It was launched on by Zenit-3F launcher, from Baikonur
	Cosmodrome to perform research on the structure and dynamics
	of radio sources within and beyond our galaxy. Together with some
	of the largest ground-based radio telescopes.
	✓ this telescope forms interferometric baselines extending up to
	350,000 km

	✓ The first ever Law Commission was created in 1834 via the 1833 Charter
	Act.

	✓ Vast majority of them are unemployable and lacking in skills such as



creative thinking, problem solving, learnability, human-centred design,
collaboration and customer-centricity
 ✓ As per the HRD Ministry, India has 6,214 engineering and technology institutions which admit 2.9 million students. Every year, 1.5 million fresh engineers are released into the job market. ✓ But sadly, only graduates who pass out of some 200 top colleges in the country come with some level of job-ready skills. ✓ A majority of jobseekers don't get jobs in line with their education or wage expectation, because of a yawning academia-industry gap. Industry seeks people with 90% skill, but 90% of academic activities are still based on theoretical learning.
 ✓ The urgency in reskilling and upskilling engineering graduates ✓ Today's businesses need finance professionals, people managers and intelligent problem solvers, not accountants, payroll assistants and coders. ✓ If India has to reap rich demographic dividends, skill development needs to be taken up far more seriously. ✓ Edu-ployment (education + employment) space, with job-readiness programmes designed to upskill engineering graduates with job-ready and future-ready expertise is the need of the hour. ✓ Academic courses faces the real risk of being driven to irrelevance and outdated material unless it matches curricula and teaching methodologies that are designed around current industry needs, and are flexible enough to respond to future challenges.

What is	 ✓ Anthrax is a serious infectious disease caused by gram-positive, rod-
anthrax	shaped bacteria known as Bacillus anthracis. Anthrax can be found
	naturally in soil and commonly affects domestic and wild animals around the world.
	✓ According to officials from the Health Department, anthrax can spread in three forms — cutaneous anthrax (through the skin), pulmonary anthrax (through inhalation), and gastrointestinal anthrax (through the stomach).
	✓ In Cutaneous anthrax, anthrax spores get into the skin usually through a



- cut or a scrape, which can happen when a person handles infected animals.
- ✓ After consumption of affected animals' meat, there are chances of contracting gastrointestinal anthrax.
